Transitions

In writing, a **transitional word** or phrase connects or relates ideas. Think of **transitions** as glue, ensuring clarity and an effortless flow of ideas and words. Transitions might occur within a sentence, between ideas of a paragraph, or between paragraphs or sections.

Common Transitional Words and Phrases

If you want	Try these transitional words and phrases

Compare the two paragraphs below. Without some of the **transitions**, ideas are hard to follow and choppy, and the wording is abrupt. With the **transitional** "glue," the ideas become clearer, and the message becomes more memorable.
